Guidebook for foreign students in Morocco

Second edition- September 2007

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Preamble

This guidebook is conceived for new foreign students wishing to carry on their studies within the public higher education institutions in Morocco.

The Moroccan Agency for International Cooperation, in collaboration with the partner departments, has prepared this guidebook to provide foreign candidates, susceptible to carry on their studies in Morocco and those already pursuing their studies in the Kingdom, with useful and practical information relating to the requirements, terms and admission procedures within the public education institutions (file contents and presentation, registration, scholarship grant, stay ...) and to help them getting integrated in the Moroccan student and social life.

I- Portrait of Morocco

Geographical position:

The Kingdom of Morocco (official name) is situated in the far Northwest of Africa. From the North, it is bordered by the Mediterranean Sea, and from the West by the Atlantic Ocean (2 sea fronts extending over 3000 Km), and it is separated from the European Continent by the Strait of Gibraltar (14 Km). The Kingdom shares boundaries with Mauritania in the South, and Algeria in the East.

The surface area of Morocco is 710.850 km², and Rabat is its political and administrative capital

Being in the Greenwich time zone, Morocco adopts the Greenwich Mean Time.

Population

The legal population of Morocco is about 30 millions of inhabitants, with an urban population of 55,1% according to the general population and housing census of September 2004.

Political system

Morocco, a sovereign Muslim state, is a democratic, social and constitutional Monarchy, governed by the Constitution of 1972 which was amended in 1980, in 1992, and in September 1996. The motto of the country is: "God, the Country, the King".

Morocco is a part of the Grand Arab Maghreb. As an African State, it has some objectives, among which the achievement of the African unity.

MOHAMMED VI is the 23rd monarch of the Alaoui Dynasty, ruling over Morocco since the 17th century. The King is not only the Head of the State, but he is also "Amir Al Mouminine (Commander of the Faithful)" and hence he is endowed with a moral and spiritual authority.

The Parliament is bicameral: the House of Representatives, elected by direct universal suffrage and the House of Counsellors, elected through indirect suffrage.

The Constitution consecrates the multi-party as well as individual, trade unions and associative freedoms. Thus, Article 3 of the Constitution of 1996 stipulates that “political parties, unions, district councils and trade chambers shall participate in the organization and representation of the citizens. There shall be no one-party system”.

The Government, composed of the Prime Minister and the Ministers, is answerable to the King and the Parliament. After the appointment of the government’s members by the King, the Prime Minister appears before each one of the two Houses of the Parliament to present the program to be carried out.

Administrative organization

The Kingdom of Morocco is composed of 16 regions divided into 18 wilayas. The latter are subdivided into provinces and prefectures including 1547 urban and rural communes.

Weather

The dominating weather in Morocco is the Mediterranean one, temperate in the West and the North due to the Atlantic Ocean. The climate is more continental inside with important differences of temperature. And while the Atlas zone is humid, with frequent snowfall, the desert climate dominates the South.

Generally, this weather combines a dry summer with low rainfall and high temperatures and a winter rainy season.

Language

Arabic is the official language of the country. However, French is widely used. Spanish, English, German and Italian are taught in secondary and high schools as well as universities.

Religion

While Islam is the official religion of the State, the constitution allows the practice of other revealed religions.

Currency

The national currency is the Dirham (DH), which is subdivided into 100 cents. Indicative change rate:

II- Presentation of the Moroccan Agency for International Cooperation (AMCI)

The Moroccan Agency for International Cooperation (AMCI), which headquarters are in Rabat, was created in 1986 to be a flexible, quick and efficient tool for the implementation of the Kingdom's cooperation policy.

The Agency's assignment is to implement and develop the cultural, scientific, technical and economic relationships with the countries' partners in the South-South cooperation, to strengthen and extend the efficient solidarity links uniting Morocco with those countries.

The Agency intervenes in numerous diversified fields which can be divided into three important sections:

- **Executives' training:** it's the oldest AMCI activity where the most concrete and sustainable results were achieved;
- **Technical cooperation,**
- **Economic and financial cooperation.**

The AMCI Executives' training department consists of the following sections:

- * Coordination, Evaluation and Statistics Section (DFCI);
- * The Arab World and Asia Section (DFC2);
- * West Africa Section (DFC3);
- * Southern, Central and East Africa Section (DFC4);
- * Social and Cultural Action Section (DFC5).

II. Organization of Higher Education in Morocco

In Morocco, higher education consists of the public higher education and the private one.

The public higher education is provided in universities as well as in higher education institutions not depending of universities. It offers multiple subjects, choices and specialities(engineering, sciences and technical subjects, technology, medical and paramedical studies, literary, law, economic, social and management studies, pedagogical and vocational training, etc ...) and prepares for national diplomas in all cycles (from secondary school diploma+1 to secondary school diploma+8: bachelor's degree or equivalent, MBA, PhD, state engineering diploma, university diploma of technology, higher/ specialized technician diploma, vocational training certificate...).

University Higher education:

It is provided throughout the Kingdom by 14 Universities (see list in annex).

Pursuant to the university reform carried out since the academic year 2003/2004, this education, whose entire pedagogical structure is based on the LMD system (BA- MBA-PhD), is organized in cycles, majors and modules.

The university year is composed of 2 semesters, each consisting of 16 teaching and evaluation weeks.

A semester consists generally of 4 modules.

A stream is a training program consisting of a coherent set of modules carried out in one or several disciplinary fields having as a goal the student's acquisition of knowledge, skills and abilities.

A BA stream consists of 24 modules while an MBA stream consists of 16 modules.

The module is the fundamental unit of the training system. It consists of one to four coherent module elements that can be taught in one or many languages. A module element can either be a subject taught as theoretical courses and/or guided/practical works, or a practical activity consisting of field works or of a project, or a training period. The different elements of a module constitute a coherent unit. A practical activity can constitute a part of a module, an entire module or many modules.

BA cycle consists of 4 semesters (3 years after the secondary school diploma /baccalaureat).

Module validation and acquisition: a module is validated if the obtained mark is higher than, or equal to 10 out of 20, and if no mark of one of its elements is lower than the limit mark specified in the instructions about this module. In the BA's cycle, a module is acquired either via validation or compensation. A module is acquired via compensation if the student validates the semester in which this module exists.

The university sets up the requirements for registration in a module.

Semesters' validation: a semester is validated if the average of obtained marks is at least equal to 10 out of 20 and if no mark in any of these modules is lower than the limit mark specified in the instructions about this module.

Requirements to obtain a diploma:

1- A major in the BA cycle is validated in case one of the following requirements is met:

- All major modules are validated
- All semesters are validated.

The General University Studies Diploma/ Practical University Studies Diploma can be issued upon request from the concerned persons having validated the first four semesters of the BA's major.

2- A major in an MBA cycle is validated when all the major modules are validated.

A validated right gives right to the relevant diploma.

Higher education in institutes not depending of universities:

Morocco has developed a significant and diversified infrastructure for higher education institutes, depending on different ministerial departments, in order to meet specific or some sectors' needs. These institutes participate, with universities, in the national effort to receive students and train them, in the optimization of infrastructures' use and for the mobilization of available managing resources, as well as in higher education diversification through the innovation in training and research programs.

Training in these institute is carried out for a period covering 1 to 6 years. Each institute is managed according to its own statutes and fulfills its functions within the higher education national political framework .

As part of the reform implemented since the university year 2003-2004, some of these institutes should gradually adopt the LMD system starting from the academic year 2007-2008.

Access to some higher education institutes is made via a competitive examination, a test or a selection.

Education in public higher education institutes is free of charge. In some very limited cases, the student is asked to buy an outfit or a particular equipment.

N.B: The average vocational training is provided by institutes depending of some ministerial departments. They prepare for the following titles:

- Technician diploma: This two years training is accessible to students having carried out the 3rd year secondary school studies (baccalaureat level).

- Qualification certificate: This two years cycle is opened to students having carried out the 4th fundamental education studies.

Among foreigners, only those who are permanently living in Morocco are admitted to these two cycles, and upon their requests, students having carried out with difficulty and/or unsuccessfully their studies at Moroccan public higher education institutes (high school diploma/bac +).

IV- Terms of application and pre-registration

Registration offer

Each year, the Moroccan government offers educational seats quotas, with or without scholarships, in Moroccan public higher education, for the benefit of candidates from partner countries.

Application files presentation

To get a registration in Morocco, applications should be submitted through diplomatic channels to the AMCI, according to the terms and within the deadlines communicated each year by the Agency to the Moroccan diplomatic representations abroad, and in accredited embassies in Rabat.

Only students proposed officially and those whose files are accepted by the AMCI can benefit from a registration and eventually from a scholarship from the Moroccan government.

Exam and files selection

Exam and files selection are ensured by the AMCI and possibly with the representatives designed by the concerned authorities in the beneficiary countries, pursuant to the quotas and criteria settled beforehand.

The list of accepted candidates, with their majors, is also communicated through diplomatic channels.

Required documents for the application file:

The application file should necessarily include the following documents:

- An application from the candidate indicating, in order of preference, the requested majors and institutes, and mentioning clearly his contact details (Address, telephone, Email).
- Application form to be downloaded from the AMCI website, duly filled and joined with the following documents, in two copies:
 - A certified copy of the secondary school certificate/baccalaureat;
 - A certified copy of the secondary school report;
 - A birth certificate;
 - A passport copy;
 - A medical certificate issued by public health services certifying the candidate's physical aptitude and the fact of his being free from any contagious or acute disease or bearing a pandemic disease (the candidate may be forced to undergo contre-visites as soon as he arrives to Morocco);
 - 2 recent identity color photos bearing at the back the first and last name as well as the nationality of the candidate;
 - Candidates for MBA studies must provide, in addition to the abovementioned documents, certified copies of their higher education diplomas, reports and curricula of studies carried out as well as an end of studies dissertation/thesis.
 - Candidates for PhD studies must also provide a PhD dissertation paper project.

N.B: Incomplete files are not taken into consideration.

Files selection is made according to the criteria and requirements listed hereafter:

General requirements for admission

a- Normal cycles

Secondary school candidates' selection is made according to the academic quality of their files, admission requirements for the requested education, opened majors and available seats.

Age requirements vary, according to the institutes, between 18 and 23 years.

As far as registrations in preparatory classes for the entrance examinations for the Grandes Écoles for engineers, higher schools and institutes of agronomic and veterinary sciences and of architecture as well as the general and dental medicine faculties, candidates must be holders of a secondary school diploma the same year of registration, with at least the "good" distinction.

For the other majors, the secondary school diploma must be obtained in the registration year and in some cases in the previous year with at least a "quite good" distinction.

b- MBA, 3rd cycle and PhD

MBA, 3rd cycle and PhD candidates should be holders of a higher studies diploma (bac+3, +4 or +5) in the requested major with a "very good" or "good" distinction.

PhD candidates must be holders of a higher studies diploma in the requested major or an equivalent diploma giving access to the concerned institutes.

N.B: In some cases, definitive registration in higher education institutes in Morocco is determined by the presentation of a certificate testifying the equivalence of the obtained diploma or of the required national diploma, pursuant to the Decree n°2-01-333 of Rabii I 20, 1422 (June 21, 2001) according to the requirements and procedures for granting higher education diplomas equivalence.

Candidates' files meeting the general requirements and pre-selected by the AMCI are submitted, for attribution, to the scientific committees of the concerned educational institutes.

French is the official language in the majority of the educational institutes in Morocco, especially in the scientific and technical majors. Thus, and within the cooperation programs agreed upon with some non French-speaking countries, candidates from these countries should undergo, during their first year, an upgrading training in the French language at the Faculty of Education Sciences in Rabat, at the end of which, those who succeed in written and oral exams are steered towards the proposed educational majors according to the requirements and seats availability.

V- Useful measures to be taken before leaving to Morocco

Any candidate accepted for a training in Morocco should claim for the information letter set up in his name by the AMCI and sent to the authorities of his homeland via the embassy of Morocco accredited in this country or the latter's diplomatic representation in Rabat.

This letter bears the main information concerning the education proposed to him as well as the definitive requirements for registration and stay in Morocco. Candidates having filled their application file for a training in Morocco should proceed beforehand to get their passport.

After receiving their pre-registration in Morocco, they should get information from the Embassy of the Kingdom of Morocco or from the closest consulate to their residence about the procedures to get the entry visa to Morocco.

VI- Reception, terms of registration and stay in Morocco

Arrival to Morocco and administrative procedures

Upon their arrival in Morocco, students are submitted to the usual boundary line procedures. In some cases, the Agency, if it is requested to do so, calls in advance the police authorities in order to facilitate visas grant upon arrival as well as the other administrative and customs procedures, for students.

Currency change

It is recommended to students to make the currency change at the authorized bank either at the airport or upon their arrival in Rabat. Students must beforehand enquire about the foreign currencies convertible in Morocco (see annex).

Transportation

The Agency can ensure, upon request from the concerned country authorities, the reception and transport of new students, from Mohammed V Airport of Casablanca or Rabat-Salé Airport in Rabat. They should, however, arrive in groups, otherwise, they can freely take any kind of the available transportation means (train, bus, taxi).

Registration

As soon as he reaches Rabat, the student should go to the concerned section within the Department for Executives' Training, reporting to the Agency, located at "9, Rue Ghana Ocean"- Rabat- Phone N0. :037 73 20 59, 037 73 20 48, 037 73 21 85 in order to:

- Fill in the registration and scholarship file (if he benefits from it);
- Get the registration authorization;

- Receive, for students enjoying AMCI scholarship, the first bi-monthly (September/October) scholarship.

Then the student should:

- Join the institute where he was accepted in order to proceed to the definitive registration;
- Send/drop off, at the AMCI, a certified true copy of the registration certificate issued by the training institute.

N.B: the presence of the accepted candidate in Morocco means that he has accepted the proposition which was made to him.

Changing major, institute or city is not allowed.

Conditions for staying in Morocco

After registration and lodging procedures, the foreign student should call on the foreigners' section, reporting to the General Department for the National Security, in the city where he is registered, in order to get his residence permit in Morocco,. He should submit the following documents:

- A certified true copy of registration certificate;
- A certified true copy of the scholarship certificate or a certificate issued by the accredited Embassy in Rabat, taking responsibility for non grant holders, or a bank account certificate;
- Residence certificate or certified true copy of a leasing contract, of a rent or water and electricity quietus;
- Copy of passport bearing the last entry date;
- Identity photo (small format): 9 for the new students and 4 for card renewal;
- A 60DH stamp;
- Administrative form to be filled in by the applicant.

N.B: Generally, foreign students have three months, starting from the entry date to Morocco, to regularize their stay situation at the National Security sections in their residence city. Residence permit is to be renewed each year.

VII- AMCI scholarship grant

AMCI grants training scholarships to foreign students within the requirements and according to the terms determined by scholarship rules.

AMCI scholarships are granted each year:

- Within the framework of the cooperation agreements, agreed upon by the AMCI and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation, on the one hand, and the concerned authorities of the partner countries on the other hand;
- As part of the Moroccan offer of scholarships, notified in the beneficiary countries;
- According to the number of scholarships allowed for in the Agency budget.

Training scholarships are granted to students holders of a secondary school diploma or an equivalent recognized diploma and who have to carry out higher studies classes in public

institutes, during a minimum of one year, at the end of which, they will receive a recognized diploma.

Training scholarships are support scholarships. Granting them does not imply, in any way, the undertaking of registration, school boarding, transportation fees or any other fees relating to studies.

Training scholarship's amount is 750,00 DH (seven hundred fifty dirhams) monthly regardless the nature of the training or its duration.

Training scholarships are granted for 12 months, each academic year, and for the normal duration of the training classes, be it from 1 to 7 years plus an additional year, called reserve scholarship year.

Scholarships are bi-monthly paid in advance at the headquarters of the Agency, for students residing in Rabat and the neighboring areas and within the university institutes determined for students living in other university cities of the Kingdom.

For other practical considerations, the bimonthly scholarships of September/October are paid in Rabat only.

At the beginning of each academic year, a cash voucher is given to scholarship beneficiaries in addition to a scholarship certificate for the concerned year.

Any change in the education career, institute or city without prior agreement of the AMCI leads to the cancellation of the scholarship.

Scholarship students can benefit, at the end of their training cycle, from a basic contribution relating to the printing fees of their dissertation paper.

VIII- Terms of re-registration, and of changing institute, major or city.

Re-registration

Re-registration in the training institute is carried out by the student at the end of each academic year.

All foreign students, registered in public institutes in Morocco, who have to carry out their training during the following academic year, should complete their file, at the Moroccan Agency for International Cooperation, by the following documents:

- Before August 10 of each year: certified copies of result certificate and of mark sheets/reports
- Before September 30: 2 certified copies of the re-registration certificate for the concerned the academic year.

N.B: Renewal of AMCI scholarship depends on the provision of these documents and will allow files up-dating and making out administrative certificates issued by the Agency.

Institute, major or city change

Foreign students, regularly registered in public educational institutes may ask for institute, major or city change for the following academic year. Are accepted only the requests made for the following reasons:

- Specialty/branch change provided the latter is not taught at the original registration institute, on the one hand, and that the requested change falls within the framework of studies continuation in the major and the concerned training cycle (students admitted to higher levels), on the other hand.
- Institute change for students dismissed, for educational reasons, from some training institutes where studies regulation does not allow year repeating.
- City change for health reasons, subject to the student bringing a medical file in addition to a favorable notice from the person in charge of the AMCI medico-social center.

Transfer terms

- Students registered in university institutes (faculties, ENCG, ENSA, ENSAM, EST, translation school) wishing to register in another university institute should carefully fill in the printed form of registration transfer to be withdrawn from the concerned sections within their registration institutes or university. The printed form should include the favorable notice as well as the seal of the original registration institution and, if possible, of reception.
- Students registered in higher education institutes not depending of universities must fill in the printed form of registration transfer put at their disposal at the Executives' Training Section at the AMCI. They can also download it from its website.

Files should include the following documents, in two copies, and sent to the Agency before August 20 of each year:

- Printed form of registration transfer dully filled in,
- Cover letter and evidence,
- Copy of result certificate and of the report for the end of the concerned academic year.

Change application must be presented via the Embassy of the country of origin in Rabat

Institution, study option or city change depend on the prior agreement of the AMCI, on the definitive agreement of the requested training institute and on the authorization of the concerned ministerial departments.

Application files for registration transfer from the vocational training institutes to the university institutes as well as registration transfers to institutes with regulated access are not considered.

Important note:

Students having finished their studies in Morocco must join their countries at the end of the study cycle for which their application had been accepted.

Any studies or training extension in Morocco can not be considered unless approved by AMCI and the concerned authorities of the original, country and within the limit of the available seats in the considered cycle and major.

XII- Other services for the benefit of students

Foreign students regularly registered in public higher education institutes can, within the limit of available rooms, live in students' hall of residence, in counterpart of a rent payment.

The Agency has in Rabat an International students' hall of residence situated in Hay Riad, with a capacity of 798 beds, from which 268 are reserved for girls.

The maximum regulation duration of lodging in students' halls of residence, depending of Higher Education Department, is 3 years.

Students lodging in the International Students' hall of residence, depending of the Agency in Rabat, benefit from lodging for a normal duration of studies in the concerned cycle.

Students wishing to lodge in the international students' hall of residence should submit their applications to the AMCI. They can resort to the private sector concerning location. In this case, they must set up with the owner a leasing contract they will be asked to bring while preparing the application file to obtain the residence permit.

Summer lodging

Each year, the Agency ensures, within the limit of the offered possibilities, the lodging, during summer vacations in the international student's hall of residence, of foreign students who are unable to return back to their country for vacations.

Catering

Many students' halls of residence have restaurants serving meals for students at a subsidized rate (1,40DH/meal).

To obtain a restaurant card, the interested students must see the administration of the cities.

University libraries

Faculties, schools and institutes are equipped with libraries offering a wide range of books and documents available to students depending on the specialties, and filed according to the institute's interest.

The International students' hall of residence in Rabat has a library opened to resident foreign students.

Medical cover:

Foreign students, as Moroccan students, benefit from the free medical care services offered by hospitals and public health centers covering the Moroccan territory as a whole and which provide 24h/24h and 7d/7d services.

Medico-social service within the International students' hall of residence, depending of the Agency, offers the same care services to foreign students, especially to those carrying out studies in Rabat. It constitutes, moreover, a reception, listening, information and orientation site towards hospital centers.

Furthermore, AMCI contributes in paying for medical fees through the repayment of the amounts undertaken by students benefiting from cooperation scholarship, up to 5%, with an upper limit of 1000 dirhams per year for care and 300 dirhams for medical glasses cost.

The private sector provides also consultation and hospitalization services.

Interested students can, moreover, contract insurance policies (disease insurance, death insurance ... etc) at the private insurance establishments.

Cultural and sportive activities

In order to foster foreign students integration in the reception society, the Agency, in coordination with the national associations of students as well as with African Students and Trainees Confederation in Morocco, organizes, supervises and supports, throughout the year, different cultural, sportive and social events organized in the students' hall of residence by and for foreign and national students as well.

These activities constitute real opportunities for interaction and exchange with other students.
